

Basic Early Buddhist Teachings

Existence

The "Three Marks": imperfection, impermanence, non-essentialism.

Interdependence

Everything arise in interdependence.

Cause and effect

Acts have unavoidable consequences for oneself and for others.

Enlightenment

Spiritual life through respect of others' life, compassion, non-violence, and cultivation of mind.

Internationalization.





Institutions

Soka University, Tokyo; Soka University of America; System of primary schools, junior and senior high schools in Japan; kindergartens in Singapore and Hong Kong

- the courage to respect, to strive to understand, and to grow from encounters with people of different cultures;
- the compassion to maintain empathy that extends to those suffering in distant places.
