Peace Budget? War Budget! How Militarism and the War Economy Affect YOU

Journalist, writer, and activist Juan González has been a celebrated staff columnist at the New York Daily News since 1988. In 1998, and again in 2011, he received the prestigious George Polk Journalism Award for his investigative journalism. Twice named one of the hundred most influential Latinos in the US by Hispanic Business magazine, he received a lifetime achievement award from the Hispanic Academy of Media Arts and Sciences. In 1981, González helped launch the National Congress for Puerto Rican Rights, the nation's foremost Puerto Rican civil rights organization, and became its first president.

Known for his incisive news coverage of foreign policy, the labor movement, race relations, and the urban crisis. González is one of the few active American journalists working in a mainstream media institution who are openly critical of what he perceives as a crisis in the quality and reliability of news in the United States. He attributes the causes of the crisis to the absence of "a diversity of opinions and analyses about the news," a reality driven by the economic and political considerations of the giant multimedia corporations that own the nation's major newsrooms and newspapers. In an interview with the website News Watch, González poignantly described the consequences of these developments: "We must all be ashamed that Americans have more access to information and news than any people in the history of the world, yet our general understanding of world affairs is sometimes worse than that of people in some of the poorest Third World countries."

González has been indispensable to the project of training and nurturing generations of African American, Asian, and Latino and Latina journalists and to eradicating stereotypical reporting. A founding member of the National Association of Hispanic Journalists, he was elected its president in June 2002. He is also a founding member of UNITY: Journalists of Color, Inc. Through his activism and writing, González has helped illuminate the impact demographic trends in the Latino and Latina population will have on American society and on future media networks seeking to report on the complexity of these changes.

Tom Martinez is the senior minister at All Souls Bethlehem Church, a progressive house church open to the world religions but grounded in the Christian tradition. He is a Board member of Brooklyn For Peace and of Brooklyn Congregations United.

Dr. Shaik Ubaid is a founding member and co-chair of the New York chapter of Muslim Peace Coalition USA, a newly formed multi-state alliance to fight bigotry and hatemongering. He was the founding national coordinator of Coalition Against Genocide, a broad-based coalition

Session 3: Building Transnational Solidarity in Honduras

Doctoral candidate **Gregory Scott Harris**, M.A., will discuss the aftermath of the June 2009 military coup in Honduras. The people of Honduras are demanding a participatory democratic process to reorder the political and economic geography of their country.

The U.S. has been deeply involved in Honduras for many years, supporting torture and dictators. This presentation will be organized around pictures taken at the one-year anniversary of resistance to the coup d'état and at a series of marches, concerts and events surrounding the work of the Truth Commission and human rights and social movement activists.

This workshop will present the basics of communications skills for use in a conflict setting in order to pursue positive growth from conflict. The session will begin with a quick activity showing that conflict can be an opportunity for change and growth, followed by a discussion of our BLT model (body, language, and tone) and a lecture on active listening, coupled with an active listening activity. Presented by Americorps volunteers Lizzie DeWan and Micah Weiss from the Crown Heights Mediation Center, this workshop aims to share tools to address conflict in a productive and effective way. Dr. Thomas Fasy, MD, PhD, is an Associate Professor of Pathology, Mount Sinai School of Medicine. In 2003, he visited sites in Baghdad contaminated with depleted uranium (DU), and currently he lectures on the toxic effects of DU dust and studies the effects of uranium on the immune system in rodents. **Andrew Johnson** is a member of IVAW and a US Army veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom. **Elizabeth (Betta) Broad** is Deputy Director of Earth Day New York.

Brooklyn For Peace

Brooklyn For Peace is a diverse network of Brooklyn residents alarmed by the growing militarism of our society and its impact on our lives as well as the lives of people in other countries. After working together for 23 years as Brooklyn Parents for Peace, we adopted a more inclusive new name: Brooklyn For Peace. Our concern for future generations continues to unite us, and we have chosen a name to reflect that.

We organize community meetings and forums, set up information tables, participate in phone and advertising campaigns, meet with elected officials and participate in demonstrations. We disseminate solid and carefully researched analysis on international and domestic policies.

We are a democratically functioning group made up of committees that plan and carry out educational activities. Current committees include: Iraq, Anti-Militarism, Israel/Palestine, Latin America, UNICEF, Darfur/Africa, Diversity/Outreach, Fundraising, Nuclear Zero, and Peace Fair. We have a Board of Directors responsible for determining priorities and programs. Since our work is primarily educational, we are incorporated as a not-for-profit 501(c)3 corporation.

Brooklyn For Peace is committed to building a world free of war and the social injustices that are its causes. We seek to educate our community and ourselves on international and domestic issues so that we can be effective in securing a peaceful future. We believe, given the right tools, ordinary people can change the world.

Brooklyn College Student Center

Founded in 1962 by students, the Student Center has a rich history of community service and rich educational and social activities. Affectionately referred to as SUBO, the Brooklyn College Student Center continues to be the hub of student life on campus. Under the collaborative leadership of staff and students, the Center serves as the preferred venue for special events and meetings that are consonant with the College's mission. Space at the Center gives students opportunity to demonstrate commitment to service, international and community programming, leadership development, model citizenship, community partnering, and professionalism. Iraq Veterans Against the War

IVAW is a nation-wide organization composed of servicemembers and veterans who have served since September 11, 2001. Its mission is to mobilize the military community to withdraw its support from the war and occupations in Iraq and Afghanistan.

IVAW was founded in July 2004 at the annual convention of Veterans for Peace in Boston, to give a voice to the large number of active-duty servicemembers and veterans who are against this war but are under various pressures to remain silent.

The membership includes recent veterans and active-duty servicemen and women who have served since September 11, 2001 in any branch of the U.S. Military Service, National Guard, or Reserve.

IVAW's strategy is to mobilize the military community to withdraw its support for the war and occupation in Iraq. Therefore, IVAW is leading the movement of veterans and GIs who are working to bring the troops home now.

Today, IVAW members are in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., and Canada, and on numerous bases overseas, including Iraq. IVAW has chapters around the country and abroad. Members educate the public about the realities of the Iraq war by speaking in communities and to the media about their experiences. Members also speak with youth in classrooms about the realities of military service. IVAW supports all those resisting the war, including conscientious objectors and others facing military prosecution for their refusal to fight. IVAW advocates for full funding for the
